About Water and Energy for Food (WE4F): A Grand Challenge for Development

The Water and Energy for Food (WE4F): A Grand Challenge for Development is a joint international initiative of the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ), the European Union (EU), the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Netherlands, Sweden through the Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency (Sida) and the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID).

WE4F is designed to address barriers to enable the production of more food with efficient and sustainable usage of water and energy along the value chain from farming to end- user, to impact food security, gender and poverty reduction in an environmentally sustainable way.

Together with partners and investors, the [South and Southeast Asia Regional Innovation Hub \(S/SEA RIH\)](#) supports mid to later stage enterprises to scale innovations that positively impact food security in an environmentally sustainable way. This is through grants, technical assistance (TA) and investment facilitation supports. Supported innovations use less water and more sustainable energy to produce more food, protect biodiversity and mitigate the effects of climate change while providing opportunities to women, youth, and the poor. The S/SEA RIH is implemented by Tetra Tech ES, Inc. in association with CrossBoundary and DevWorks International.

With this document, the S/SEA RIH invites eligible service providers to respond to WE4F's Call for Expressions of Interest (EOI) to become part of the pool of pre-vetted service providers to deliver technical assistance. As TA needs are identified, requests for proposals (RFPs) and requests for quotation (RFQs) will be issued to pre-vetted service providers in their respective TA category area. All subcontracts resulting from limited competition among pre-vetted service providers will be issued by Tetra Tech ES, Inc.

Objective of the EOI

EOIs submitted by applicants are to help the WE4F S/SEA RIH identify registered companies who are interested in being included in a pool of pre-vetted service providers and provide services to the innovators supported by WE4F between 2021 to 2024. Being selected to participate in the pre-vetted pool of service providers does not guarantee any award from the WE4F S/SEA RIH. Instead, it provides an opportunity to bid on RFPs and/or RFQs with specific scopes of work to provide TA to innovators.

Why be part of Water and Energy for Food?

The South and Southeast Asia region is subject to many challenges including intensive energy and water uses that exacerbate climate change, depletion of natural resources and biodiversity loss, poverty and

inequality. Tackling issues in the water-energy-food nexus is imperative to achieve political and social stability gender equality and inclusion, food security, and sustainable development.

Despite the challenges the region faces, at the same time, it presents an emerging opportunity for local innovators to find solutions for the most pressing water and energy issues in food production and agriculture while countering the effects of climate change and protecting biodiversity.

These innovators, however, often have insufficient entrepreneurial capacities to scale up developed prototypes successfully and sustainably, access catalytic investment, integrate gender into their operations, or engage with policy and regulation environments. They require specific support services to unlock such opportunities to scale their solutions, prepare them to accelerate their growth and achieve good Environmental, Social and Governance (ESG) impact.

Therefore, WE4F S/SEA RIH will not only provide direct support to the 40 innovators (Tier 1 support), but also work with pre-vetted service providers to assist in delivering such services (Tier 2 support), as part of a comprehensive support suite to help accelerate the growth of innovators.

The Call for EOIs is launched to build a pool of qualified service providers to deliver a variety of services to the innovators supported by WE4F S/SEA RIH.

Target Innovators of the WE4F Grand Challenge

WE4F works with entrepreneurship and innovation through the following actors:

- For-profit and non-profit organizations as well as organizations in academia with a for-profit arm that are working on scalable sustainable innovations at the nexus of water-energy-food. These organizations can apply through the Calls for Innovations.
- Actors that are identified by the Regional Innovation Hub and fit the criteria of WE4F and are crucial for the scaling of impacts.
- Innovators with a large potential for sustainable scaling that have previously received support and proved successful in the introduction phase from either Securing Water for Food or Powering Agriculture Grand Challenges (WE4Fs preceding programs).

Innovations supported by WE4F includes, but are NOT limited to, the themes mentioned below:

- Theme 1: Innovations in food production to reduce water usage
- Theme 2: Efficient use of water resources for food production
- Theme 3: Sustainable use of energy and water on farm
- Theme 4: Energy innovations for food processing and/or logistics
- Theme 5: Food production with efficient energy use
- Theme 6: Leveraging food/agriculture waste for energy

Who should apply to join the pre-vetted pool of service providers?

The first call for service providers will only target the following eight countries of the S/SEA RIH's 16 operating countries. The targeted countries for this Call for EOI are listed, alphabetically, in Table 1 and determined based on (i) current location of legacy innovators and their operations and (ii) tentative location of the expected grantees and their operations chosen through first call for innovations and (iii) where the S/SEA RIH has staff with local expertise located.

Table 2 presents all focused TA contents that the pre-vetted service providers are expected to provide. However, all services providers who specialize in each TA category are welcome to apply and be pre-vetted.

To be qualified, it is important to note the companies must be operating in at least one of the S/SEA RIH's 16 target countries: **Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Cambodia, India, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar, Nepal, Philippines, Singapore, Sri Lanka, Thailand, Timor Leste and Vietnam.**
